Food Family Farming Foundation (“F3”) is committed to protecting your privacy when you visit and use the website for thelunchbox.org as further outlined in this policy. As a condition of using certain features of F3’s website, you agree to provide F3 with certain personal information. This information includes, but not limited to your full name, email address. If you choose to donate to our project, you will provide F3 with certain financial information. Each time you visit the website, or provide us with information, you are accepting the practices described in this privacy policy at that time.

Please note that this Privacy Policy governs only the data practices of F3 at our websites; we are not responsible for the privacy policies of other sites or companies that may be linked to or otherwise contacted through our websites. Please also note that nowhere on the websites do we knowingly collect contact information from children under the age of 13. We ask that parents help ensure that children do not submit any personal information to us.

Changes to Privacy Policy

Our privacy policy may be revised over time as new features are added to the websites or as we incorporate suggestions from our users. Please review this privacy policy each time you visit. We will not specifically notify you of changes to this policy other than by posting the changes on this webpage.

How Your Information is Used

Newsletters: Unless you uncheck the appropriate box (“opt out”) for “Subscribe to Newsletter” at the time you register, we will periodically email you newsletters, press releases or other information about us and our current projects. You can “unsubscribe” at any time.

Contacting You Regarding Fundraising Efforts: You agree, in consideration for the use of our websites, to allow F3 to periodically email you information on various fundraising efforts or projects. F3 may also send you marketing and promotional materials that promote third party sponsors or supporters of F3’s projects. These materials may include additional information and promotional offers for goods and services from such third parties. F3 will not rent or sell your personal information for use by third parties. Like most websites, F3 uses small text files called “cookies” to facilitate access to our websites. Cookies cannot be used to run programs or deliver viruses to your computer, but are unique identifiers placed on your computer that can only be used by an internet server in the domain that issued the cookie to you. The primary purpose of our use of cookies is to save you time by telling our server that you have returned to a specific web page, and to remind our server of information that you may have entered on that web page previously. However, you have the ability to accept or decline cookies. Most browsers automatically accept cookies, but you can usually modify your browser setting to decline cookies if you prefer.

Disclosure to Governmental Entities

F3 may disclose specific contact information when we determine that such disclosure is necessary to comply with law, to cooperate with or seek assistance from law enforcement or to protect the interests or



safety of F3 or other visitors to the site. Also, your contact information may be passed on to a third party in the event of a merger, acquisition, consolidation, or dissolution of F3.

Internet Security

Unfortunately, no data transmission over the Internet or any wireless network can be guaranteed to be 100% secure. As a result, while we strive to protect your personal information and make commercially reasonable efforts to do so, F3 cannot ensure or warrant the security of any information you transmit to us and you do so at your own risk. However, once we receive your transmission, we make our best effort to ensure its security on our systems. F3 does not collect personal information such as a credit card. When you make a donation from our website you are redirected to the service companies' websites we use for electronic donations. You may view either Network for Good's security protocol or Pay Pal's security protocol when you are redirected to their sites to make your donation.
